

# Finnegan's sponsoring many events at this year's fair

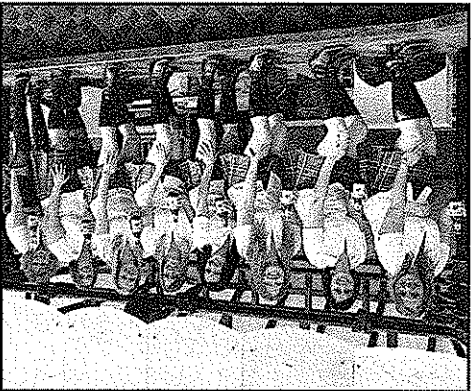
